Divine Mercy Sunday Celebration

Archbishop Bolen will be celebrating Divine Mercy Sunday, April 24, in Weyburn at St. Vincent de Paul Parish (314 3rd St NE). Adoration and Reconciliation begin at 2:30 PM, recitation of the Chaplet of Divine Mercy at 3 PM, remarks from Archbishop Bolen at 3:30 PM, followed by continued quiet prayer until Mass at 5 PM. Neighbouring priests from around the deanery will be assisting with Reconciliation. Referring to Divine Mercy Sunday, Jesus told St. Faustina, *"I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened"* (Diary 699). Everyone welcome.

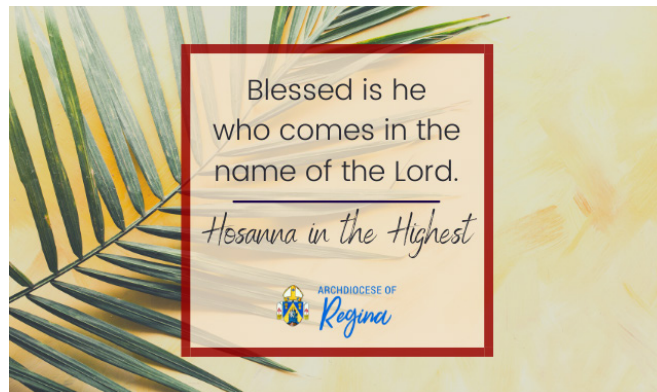
