Reflections from the Administrator's Desk

As we begin this most solemn week of the Christian year known as Holy Week, we are invited to enter into the Passion of the Lord, so all the trials and tribulations, the disappointments and sorrows, the difficulties and setbacks of our personal lives might be united to Christ's suffering and cross, that our smaller crosses and sacrifices might have redemptive merit and meaning in Christ. Might we take to heart these words by Fr. Sebastian White, OP in the April edition of the Magnificat Mass Journal: "Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are preeminent means to generosity of soul and growth in charity. These activities receive special emphasis in Lent, but ought in some measure to shape our whole Christian life. For example, maybe we can recognize that some apparently harmless activity we often engage in is in fact a waste of time, something that does not draw us closer to God and could be scaled back or given up long-term.

"Consider prayer, specifically. Perhaps at times we have been reluctant to embrace an invitation from our Lord to allow more time for prayer or for daily Mass, to make that little declaration of faith: "You are worth it, O Lord. And I trust that every moment with you—even if distractions come and there is no immediate benefit of new insights or sweet feelings—are precious beyond all reckoning." Father Donald Haggerty has written eloquently of this dynamic: "What our crucified Lord Jesus would prefer from us is something more serious in love than the customary renunciations that are part of any good life. He wants sacrificial acts in the inner life that can unleash a fire within the undercurrents of our soul. He desires us to step over the edge, as it were, in offering ourselves to him in the privacy of interior prayer. He waits for bold, irreversible acts of surrender in prayer that cannot be taken back, like marriage vows, dissolvable only in death, yet repeated continually in life. Every intense sacrificial offering of this kind stretches love into the buried depths of the soul. These acts inflame our soul's passion for God; afterward, inevitably, they compel actions of generosity for others. All radical love for God may hide its deeper mystery within such private offerings made in the quiet of prayer. Unknown but to God himself, these acts pronounce a willingness to sacrifice everything for love of him as our beloved Lord and God."

....". So in these final days of Lent, join me in praying: *Lord Jesus, I cannot be courageous and generous without you. I come to you in Holy Communion, therefore, counting on your love. Increase my love for you and my brothers and sisters today—and each day.*"
