MUSINGS & NOTES FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR'S DESK

Yesterday and today the Church celebrates the memorable double feast of mother and son, St. Monica and St. Augustine. While not precluding other means of divine intervention, nor implying that conversion is not totally the work of God's grace, there probably would not have been a St. Augustine had not been for the persistent tearful prayers, fasting & sacrifices of St. Monica over 17 years when he was baptized by St. Ambrose in 387 A.D. at the age of 32. We remain greatly indebted to St. Augustine for his scholarly writings and influence upon the Church of his day and even to this day, as this bishop and Doctor of the Church contributed mightily to the treasury of Church teaching and clarity of doctrine. Along with St. Thomas Aquinas, St. Augustine has exercised a major understanding of the Church's theology and spirituality. Yet, as the church celebrates the feast of St. Monica the day prior to St. Augustine's anniversary of his death in 430, it suggests that we should not lose sight of her prayerful tenacity and perseverance in seeking the conversion of her son so that he might find his true spiritual home in the Church and ultimately in God through His Son Jesus Christ. While we cannot phantom the mystery of Christian prayer in the mind and plan of God, as all prayers uttered are not automatically granted in the way voiced by the person, or nor do we pray to convince or change God's mind in something, it remains a vital aspect of the spiritual economy of God's plan and our relationship with God, as we are invited to pray constantly and perseveringly. Does prayer help to change the person's mindset so that they become more open to what God desires for them? Life unfolds not randomly or by accident, but with a definitive purpose in which God desires to show us His love and mercy that we might receive it in its richness with grateful and humble hearts. We are encouraged to pray constantly for all those in need of a greater conversion to God and the surrendering to His will. St. Monica reminds us by her example that we, as parents, grand-parents and the average parishioners, are to pray for all God's wayward children that they might come home to Him, the source of eternal and abiding love, salvation and redemption through the Paschal mystery of Christ's death and resurrection. This can become a very noble and self-giving way to pray for others in whatever obstacles need to be removed from their path to God and His saving mercy. St. Monica, pray for us. St. Augustine, pray for us.

By your intercession and God's grace, your son St. Augustine became a great and venerable Saint of the Church. Please take my request to God with the same fervor and persistence with which you prayed for your own son.
