## **Reflections from the Administrator's Desk**

Earlier this week, we celebrated the feasts of St. Peter Julian Eymard (1811-68) and St. John Vianney (1786-1859), both of whom had a deep love for the Eucharist in its importance for the Christian life, just we are focusing on the Bread of Life discourse from chapter 6 of St. John's Gospel over the next several Sundays. Although the Latin Mass has different gospel passages for the Sundays after Pentecost, those attending the Traditional Latin Mass obviously have a deep love and reverence for the Eucharist, so these comments will remain relevant for them also. As a result of his deep love for the Eucharist, St. Peter Julian Eymard founded the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament for men and the Servants of the Blessed Sacrament for women. He encouraged both the Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and the frequent reception of Holy Communion. St. John Vianney, also known as the Curé of Ars, was well remembered for the many hours he spent in the confessional so that people might receive Holy Communion worthily and in a state of grace by confessing their sins and making reparations for them. Both of these saintly priests have many insights to enrich our own appreciation of the Eucharist. "We must quickly get to work to save souls by the divine Eucharist, to awaken [a world] numbed in dormant apathy because they don't know the gift of God, Jesus, the Eucharistic Emmanuel. This is the torch of love which we must carry to tepid souls who haven't made Jesus in the holy tabernacle their center and their life. Any devotion which doesn't set up one tent on Calvary and one near the Tabernacle is not a solid piety and will never do anything great. I fear that people are wandering too far from the Holy Eucharist, that this mystery of love par excellence is not sufficiently proclaimed. So souls are suffering, becoming more sensual and materialistic and inordinately attached to human beings. It is because they don't know how to find their consolation and strength in our Lord. ... Remember that when we have put a Eucharistic spark into a soul we have planted a divine seed of life and all virtues in its heart." St. Peter Julian to encourage the promotion of Eucharistic Adoration. St. John Vianney wrote: "Any congregation can, if it so desires, enjoy His most sweet companionship. O happy people, what I wish to show you today is how good God was in instituting the adorable sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. ... It is heaven upon earth. Saint Bernard assures us that there are three mysteries upon which he cannot meditate without feeling as if his heart would break with love and sadness. The first is the mystery of the Incarnation, the other that of the Passion of Jesus Christ, and the third is the most adorable sacrament of the altar." As we continue attending Mass & receiving Holy Communion, may our devotion and reverence for our Eucharistic Lord grow stronger so that we might truly make Him the center of our lives and pray: "My dear Jesus, I give myself to you as you have given yourself to me." with St. Peter Julian Eymard.
