Reflections from the Administrator's Desk

If there is any sense of “accompaniment” that should be taken to heart by more people, it is that of the sick, who are both frail and vulnerable, when compared to the majority of more able-bodied persons. Jesus exhorts us in the “judgment scene in St. Matthew, chapter 25: “For I was sick and you took care of me and visited me.” In the parable of the Good Samaritan, I think that we might speculate that the priest and Levite passed by on the other side when they came upon the fellow left beaten and wounded by the side of the road perhaps because they did not want to incur ritual impurity by touching a supposedly dead corpse. But isn't it also entirely plausible that they would have reasoned thus, “if this fellow isn't dead, but still alive – then WHAT?? I would have to interrupt my journey and find some way to help him or get him somewhere for someone to look after him. I'm really too busy or in hurry to get to my destination to bother or be inconvenience with him.” Doesn't this sound familiar, like some of our rationalizations and justifications for not stopping or going to a visit a sick family or neighbor? Certainly, it may be more challenging or difficult to visit the sick or aged during these Covid times when there are restrictions as to who can actually visit the sick and even how often? The fact remains that we can always try to communicate with them by emails or telephone calls; and if this is not possible, then we can offer up prayers and sacrifices on their behalf. Then a little note and card to tell them that you are thinking of them and praying for their wellbeing would be much appreciated. It takes a little time and putting ourselves out, but we never fully know what a difference such a gesture of kindness could mean for them. Perhaps it would help if we turned the situation around in our minds by considering that it is really our privilege to be able to accompany and helps others in need. Remember Whom you are visiting and caring for in the end, and this should remove any lingering hesitancy on our part. “Lord Jesus Christ, please help me to recognize Your presence in all those I encounter in daily life.”
