Reflections from the Administrator's Desk

This coming week is populated by many wonderful saints leading to the celebration of Candlemas on February 2 --The Presentation of the Lord Jesus in the Temple {Novus Ordo}The Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary {TLM}. Starting on Monday, we celebrate continuously the Memorial of St. Francis de Sales, the Conversion of St. Paul, Sts. Timothy and Titus, the Optional Memorial for St. Angela Merici, St. Thomas Aquinas, and then next Monday, St. John Bosco. Within the TLM, they observe first St. Timothy, the Conversion of St. Paul, St Polycarp, St. John Chrysostom, St. Peter Nolasco, St. Francis de Sales and also St. John Bosco. What this illustrates is the importance of the witness of Christian holiness in the lives of these wonderful saints and martyrs of God, who have offered their lives in the service of God, the Church, and the world at large, Their testimony of faith and the example of faithfulness was not just limited to the sphere of the Church itself but extends beyond to their social milieu outside the Church proper. When we practice genuine charity & compassion, mercy & forgiveness, patience & generosity, the quality of life for everyone is enhanced and improved, So, we do well by reading the lives and writings of the saints of the Church, for they inspire us by their good example, and we should intercede for their help and encouragement in the various situations that challenge us. St. Paul whose conversion we celebrate on Tuesday would remind us all that it is always by the grace of God that we attain our salvation and results in all the good we accomplish in our daily lives. As St. Paul tells us in the epistle to the Galatians: "It is no longer I who lives, but Christ who lives in me." All the credit and merits belong to the Lord Jesus Christ working in and through us in the Holy Spirit.
