## **Reflections from the Administrator's Desk**

February 2nd commemorates the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple 40 days after His birth in faithful observance of the Jewish tradition of dedicating or consecrating the first-born male to the Lord and offering sacrifice of two turtle doves or young pigeons in the Temple in Jerusalem, along with observing purification of Mary His mother after childbirth. Neither Jesus nor Mary would have needed to observe these rituals given their unique identities, but they did so in obedience to their Jewish faith. This feast is known as the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary in the Traditional Latin Mass or just Candlemas.

In his homily featured on the Vatican News website two years ago, Fr. Antony Kadovil made these two observations: **1)** Every Holy Mass in which we participate is our presentation. Although we were officially presented to God on the day of our Baptism, we present ourselves and our dear ones on the altar before God our Father through our Savior Jesus Christ at every Holy Mass. Hence, we need to live our daily lives with the awareness both that we are dedicated people consecrated to God and that we are obliged to lead holy lives.

**2)** We need the assistance of the Holy Spirit to recognize the presence of Jesus in ourselves and in others: All those who, like Simeon and Anna, persevere in piety and in the service of God, no matter how insignificant their lives seem in men's eyes, become instruments the Holy Spirit uses to make Christ known to others. In His plan of redemption, God makes use of these simple souls to do much good for all mankind. In other words, The Holy Spirit employs ordinary men and women with simple faith as His instruments to bear witness to Christ, His ideals and teachings, just as He used Simeon and Anna. The Holy Spirit reveals the presence of the Lord to us when we are receptive and eager to receive Him. Let us be open to the promptings of the Holy Spirit within us to recognize the indwelling presence of the Lord with us and in others.

**FAITH MATTERS:**

This Wednesday, February 2nd, celebrates the feast of the Presentation of the Lord {The Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary in the Extra Ordinary Form} or simply Candlemas, in which there has been a long tradition of blessing candles with procession and then taking these candles home for devotional use and imploring divine protection over that family and home. Since the blessing and procession are an integral part of this liturgy and not to be altered for convenience’s sake, and all of our liturgies that day are time-sensitive, we will simply be having blessed candles according to the Roman Ritual (conferred ahead of time) available for people to take home after Mass. This will apply the **8 AM and 7 PM Masses in the Ordinary Form**, and also for the **8 PM Mass for the Extra Ordinary Form for the Latin Mass Community**. Hopefully in the future we can have the fuller celebrations in both Forms, but for now we might observe this feast in a simpler form allowing for people to attend in what they have come to expect as the normal weekday celebrations and not being caught in something that would greatly the length of time needed to properly celebrate with blessing and procession with the candles.
