## **Reflections from the Administrator's Desk**

With the Baptism of the Lord in the Novus Ordo calendar and the commemoration of the Lord's Baptism on the Octave of the Epiphany this Thursday, our Christmas season comes to an end except for its last vestige in the Presentation of the Lord (or the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary or Candlemas in TLM) on February 2nd, which we are planning to celebrate in both liturgies, God willing. It is most fitting that John the Baptist who featured prominently during Advent in preparing for the Lord's coming should be there as Jesus inaugurates His public ministry by accepting the baptism of repentance at the hands of John the Baptist (although He had nothing to repent, as He remained sinless and fully obedient to God's will) but He did so to express His total solidarity with our sinful humanity whom He came to deliver and redeem by His life, death and resurrection. His baptism by John the Baptist gives further depth to His Incarnation. Interestingly, all four gospels relate how Jesus begins His public ministry against the backdrop of how He received John's baptism and in some accounts the Father's voice from heaven declared that He was His Son, the Beloved, in whom He was well pleased. Although John the Baptist would be beheaded in prison for criticizing Herod for taking his brother's wife Herodias, shortly after Jesus began His public ministry of travelling through Judah, there was some lingering questions whether John might be the Messiah which he dispelled unequivocally by declaring that he was not worthy to even untie His sandals and that he must decrease while Christ must increase. We would do well to take this saying to heart in our full submission to God's will in all humility, so that in our obedience to Christ and His example of life, we might echo St. Paul declaring "it is no longer I who lives, but Christ who lives in me". May the celebration of the Lord's baptism help us to live more deeply the effects and graces of our own baptism as we strive to become more like Christ in everything we think, say and do. May our lives mirror and reflect His total obedience to the Father's will.
