FEAST OF ST. BONAVENTURE – JULY 15TH

Giovanni di Fidanza was born around 1221 in the Tuscan region of Italy, and received the name of Bonaventure when he entered the Franciscans in 1243. Saint Bonaventure sought wisdom in God's revelation through prayer and study. He filled the hearts of others with the fruits of his learning through his work of teaching, and in wisdom he built up the Order of Friars Minor (Franciscans) through his leadership. Since St. Francis of Assisi died in 1226, St. Bonaventure as a respected theologian proved invaluable to the Franciscans during these early years of their founding and early beginnings, as he is often referred to as the "second founder" of the Franciscans. As minister general, he solidified the order in a time of growth. Bonaventure lived humility, poverty, and single-minded devotion to Christ as a learned teacher and cardinal archbishop. A story is told of the day the papal legates arrived at the Franciscan house in Florence to bring Bonaventure the cardinal's red hat. Bonaventure was within, washing dishes. In obedience to the rule, he finished before receiving the visitors. Bonaventure died in 1274 and was named a Doctor of the Church in 1588. Like Saint Francis, Jesus was the center of everything—his teaching, his administration, his writing, and his life. So much so, that he was given the title "Seraphic Doctor."

By study, prayer, and teaching, Saint Bonaventure planted the seed of God's Word in the hearts of many. Through his writings and his intercession, with God's blessing, may our earth continue to yield a rich harvest of faith, hope, charity, and zeal for the Gospel. There is much about St. Bonaventure that we can emulate and benefit from all these many centuries later, particularly his ability and focus upon Christ and how St. Francis sought to apply Christ's gospel to the needs of his times. When there is controversy within the Church, that might result in wide swings in theological opinions, the stability and example of St. Bonaventure calls us back to our center – Jesus. Allow me to quote St. Bonaventure in this meditation:

It is a fact that all desires tend to happiness, which is a perfect state consisting of the simultaneous presence of all goods. No one

reaches this state except through a final union with him who is the foundation and origin of goods both natural and supernatural, both bodily and spiritual, both temporal and eternal. He it is who says of Himself: I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End! As all things are brought forth through the Word eternally uttered, so through the Word made flesh all things are restored and achieved. Hence, he is truly and properly called Jesus: for there is no other name under heaven given to men by which we must be saved. By believing, hoping, loving, with my whole heart, and with my whole soul, and with my whole mind, and with my whole strength, may I be carried to you, O beloved Jesus, Goal of all: for you alone are all-sufficient, you alone do save, you alone are good and delightful to those who seek you and love your name. For you, O my good Jesus, are the Redeemer of the lost, the Savior of the redeemed, the hope of exiles, the strength of laborers, the sweet consolation of anguished minds, the crown and imperial canopy of the triumphant, the only reward and joy of all the citizens of heaven, the glorious offspring of the highest God, the sublime fruit of the virginal womb, the abundant fountain of all graces, of whose fullness we have all received (Jn 1:16). ~ SAINT BONAVENTURE
