Reflections from the Administrator's Desk

With forest fires in British Columbia and parched crops in most of western Canada, the excessive heat is taken its toll upon our landscape, as the early spring expectations are quickly evaporating throughout our farming communities. As we are emerging from many of the Covid-related public health restrictions, relations with Indigenous communities over unmarked graves have reached a flashpoint, as tensions and old wounds are resurfacing with a vengeance not heard even at the height of the Truth and Reconciliation hearings and recommendations. Within this background, there is talk of a federal election on the horizon. How all this will play out is anyone's guess; but certainly we are in very hot times on so many levels. Exacerbating all this rising in temperatures is the multiple challenges facing our Church and society, where we seem to be relying on limited human resources to quell the heat and divisions that are bubbling over. While we are quick to complain about a host of issues and to find fault with those in leadership roles, we seemingly have reached the breaking point where we are fracturing at an alarming rate. Instead of the unity that Jesus prayed for among His disciples, the sense of fraternity and harmony that is described in the Acts of the Apostles in the early Christian community, we are potentially on the precipice of greater division and deeper polarization, all of which plays in the hands of Satan, the evil one. We must pray, work and offer sacrifices that this doesn't happen and result in the dismantling and destruction of our Catholic faith and Tradition. We have the assurance of Christ to be with His Church until the end of time, let us pray for the confidence and trust to remain steadfast in our faith and hope in Him, as we become witnesses and agents of His loving mercy to all those in need of His graces. This is not the time to despair nor to lose courage, but rather to double-down upon our prayers and devotions, our pondering of God's Word at Mass and in the Scriptures, our active faith involvement in the corporal & spiritual works of mercy. There is much to do, let's get at it!!!

On Monday, July 26th, the Church celebrates the memorial of St. Joachim & Anne, the parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary, so Pope Francis has designated Sunday, June 25th as the First World Day of Prayer for Grandparents & the Elderly. It connects more to the isolation and suffering of this past year with the effects of Covid. More information is included on the Archdiocesan July Bulletin. During the yearly celebrations at Mary's Grotto in July, we alternated between this memorial and Our Lady of Mt. Carmel. I recall Pope Benedict XVI's Prayer for Grandparents composed with the parents of Mary in mind, which emphasized the special blessings and source of enrichment they represent for their families, especially in being the pillars of faith, guardians of noble domestic ideals and living treasuries of sound Catholic religious traditions.
