Reflections from the Administrator's Desk

All of our Lenten disciplines and practices should foster a greater love for God & our neighbor, as they are intended to be spiritually significant and meaningful for us. This should mean that they will result in a greater openness to God and His graces working within us, along with an increased compassion towards our neighbor and their needs, physical or spiritual. On Ash Wednesday, the prophet Joel exhorted us to return to the Lord with our whole heart with fasting, weeping and mourning, to rend or tear open our hearts, not our garments. Our Lenten discipline is primarily an interior disposition of humility and surrendering to the Lord's will, as we are willingly stripped of all our attachments to worldly desires and material appetites that easily can consume all our energies and time if we are not careful to restrain ourselves. This is one of the key objectives of keeping Lent, that we might curb our desires and selfish grasping after material things, as if they can bring us to the happiness and security that we aspire to. We are to die constantly to our selfishness and pride, so that more and more we can say with St. Paul that "it is no longer I who lives, but Christ who lives in me" (Galatians 2:20). Our Lenten goal is to live a more intensely Christian life, pursuing every possibility for greater holiness, and growing in all of the Christian virtues of faith, hope & charity, along with prudence, justice, fortitude and temperance. We are called to develop a truly Christian character by living by the fruits of the Holy Spirit, namely: "charity, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control, chastity" (Galatians 5:22). In the manner that we observe fasting, deeper prayerfulness, and charitable giving and sharing with those in need, we aspire to grow closer to God by acknowledging our need and utter dependence upon God in all things, lifting our hearts and minds to Him more consistently, and to practice sacrifices so that we might become generous and willing to share ourselves, our resources, our abilities and our time with others in however we might help them physically and spiritually. Quite often I think that if we were to live more responsibly and charitably within our families, we would be growing in the Christian life, which we are then called to share with others beyond our family circles, so that nobody is left out of the sphere of our caring and loving, forgiving and showing mercy.
