Reflections from the Administrator's Desk

The Traditional Catholic calendar marks this Thursday (May 26) as Ascension Thursday, which unlike the Novus Ordo reformed liturgy of Vatican II has not transferred Ascension to the upcoming Sunday. While St. Luke's gospel describes the Ascension of Jesus at the end of His resurrected appearances, it is only in the Acts of the Apostles (also written by St. Luke) that he speaks of the Ascension of our Lord, the return of Jesus to His Father in heaven, as occurring on the fortieth day after Jesus had shown Himself to His apostles and disciples (1:3). As we have been able to celebrate the Latin Mass every Thursday evening at 7 PM, this accords an excellent opportunity to mark this first class feast in the Church's liturgical life.

Since the Lord's Ascension is a day of obligation, this feast was transferred to the following Sunday, the argument being that this change made it more possible for many more Catholics to attend Mass on a Sunday rather than on a Thursday. However, anecdotally, this rationale is not supported by the numbers of people who, for example, attend Ash Wednesday and Good Friday celebrations, even though these have not been moved to the Sunday, for the sake of this same argument.

The significance of the Ascension is that it marks the end of risen Christ's earthly ministry and appearance to the disciples, His entrustment of the Church to His apostles and His return to the Father in heaven. The Ascension signals the time of the sending of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles and disciples at Pentecost. The promised gift of the Paraclete and Advocate Whom Jesus spoke extensively at the Last Supper in St. John's Gospel is very much the fulfilment of Eastertide, even as Jesus told the apostles to await in Jerusalem for what the Father had promised (Acts 1:4-5). The Ascension of the Lord remains an important aspect of the conclusion of Jesus' earthly ministry and the role of the Church in human salvation. Here we remember Jesus' promise in St. Matthew's Gospel: "And know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time." (28:20)
