## MUSINGS & NOTES FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR'S DESK

St. Charles Borromeo (1538-1584) is one of the shining lights who came out of the Catholic Reformation. Together with St. Ignatius of Loyola and St. Philip Neri, he fought bravely for the reform of the Catholic Church and helped establish seminaries that would properly educate future priests. He was a principal actor behind the Council of Trent and assisted in the creation of the first universal catechism of the Catholic Church.

What propelled him forward was a devout prayer life coupled with a charitable heart, always striving to practice what he preached. St. Charles of Borromeo, patron saint of catechists and bishops, pray for us. *"If we wish to make any progress in the service of God we must begin every day of our life with new eagerness. We must keep ourselves in the presence of God as much as possible and have no other view or end in all our actions but the divine honor. We must meditate before, during and after everything we do. The prophet says: "I will pray, and then I will understand." This is the way we can easily overcome the countless difficulties we have to face day after day, which, after all, are part of our work. In meditation we find the strength to bring Christ to birth in ourselves and in others."*

## Prayer to One's Guardian Angel in Preparation for Death by St. Charles

**Borromeo** My good Angel: I know not when or how I shall die. It is possible I may be carried off suddenly, and that before my last sigh I may be deprived of all intelligence. Yet how many things I would wish to say to God on the threshold of eternity. In the full freedom of my will today, I come to charge you to speak for me at that fearful moment. You will say to Him, then, O my good Angel: That I wish to die in the Roman Catholic Apostolic Church in which all the saints since Jesus Christ have died, and out of which there is no salvation. That I ask the grace of sharing in the infinite merits of my Redeemer and that I desire to die in pressing to my lips the cross that was bathed in His blood! That I detest my sins because they displease Him, and that I pardon through love of Him all my enemies as I wish myself to be pardoned. That I die willingly because He orders it, and that I throw myself with confidence into His adorable Heart, awaiting all His mercy. That in my inexpressible desire to go to heaven I am disposed to suffer everything it may please His sovereign justice to inflict on me. That I love Him before all things, above all things and for His own sake; that I wish and hope to love Him with the elect, his angels and the Blessed Mother during all eternity. Do not refuse, O my Angel, to be my interpreter with God, and to protest to Him that these are my sentiments and my will. Amen.

There is now a Holy relic image of Blessed Martyr Bishop Vasyl Velychovsky at both St. Mary's & St. Anthony's. These are gifts from Blessed Vasyl's shrine in Winnipeg. Blessed Vasyl Velychovsky was born in 1903 to a priestly family in Ukraine, where his father was a married priest and his mother dedicated him at the age of 8 to Our Lady of Perpetual Help, and he had a lifelong devotion which he promoted as a Redemptorist priest after his ordination in 1925. He was arrested by the Soviets, subjected to cruel interrogations and tortures, before he was sentenced to die by a firing squad, This sentence was commuted to ten years in Soviet labour camps in the coal mines above the Arctic Circle. Upon his release, he worked for the underground Ukrainian Catholic Church, In 1959 he was appointed bishop of this underground church, but there were no bishops to ordain him until Metropolitan Josyf Slipyj was released from prison to attend the 2nd Vatican Council in Rome. Before leaving Moscow he secretly ordained Fr. Vasyl as a bishop. A second arrest in January 1969 resulted in chemical, physical, electrical and mental torture that ruined his health, whereupon near death in 1972, he was released from prison and exiled from Ukraine. He was invited to Winnipeg by Metropolitan Maxim Hermaniuk, and after a year he succumbed to the effects of the tortures and death-causing drugs and died a martyr's death on June 30, 1973, His mortal remains, a fully intact body, were transferred to a shrine housed at St. Joseph's Ukrainian Catholic Church in Winnipeg.
