## MUSINGS & NOTES FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR'S DESK

Among the great saints, Saint John Paul II surely ranks in the top tier. A rare, integrated personality, he was a charismatic blend of scholar, mystic, pastor, evangelist, and statesman. His grasp of the human person was unmatched, woven together in his landmark “theology of the body.” His commanding encyclicals restated that freedom is bonded to truth, reason to faith, the preborn baby to the Word made flesh.

Central to all that John Paul taught is one theme: gift. Everything I have is God's gift to me. My life, my being—I exist because God loves me and chose me. Likewise, I am created to give myself in return to God and to others. Simply put, my happiness, my purpose, my mission consist in my gift of self. In marriage, in consecrated life, in friendship, we are made for communion.

Now, the question: What is the most precious gift we can give another? What is the gift that we in our busy lives clutch most tightly, the gift we value most but often is hardest to give? It is our time, isn't it? Not our presents, but our presence, our presence given to another in the present moment, this moment, the only moment we have. When we think of those loved ones who have gone before us, or those children who once were under our roof, do we regret anything? If we do it is usually the conversation, the visit, the glance, the beholding we were too stingy or preoccupied to give to the one who so desired our treasure. Time hoarded flees anyway; it never comes back, except in memory.

In the end, will we be judged by what we checked off a list, or by what we gave in time to the other? If we learn John Paul's law of the gift, we remember there is still time in God's mercy to look, to see, to treasure, to love. We yet have time to let loose of our time and give it away. May God redeem our time—the time we threw away and the time still to give.

**Archbishop's Appeal:** Giving is a key way to deepen our faith and to grow spiritually, an opportunity to live as disciples of Jesus. In our call to serve others, we join in the work of building God's kingdom here and now. Through the Archbishop's Appeal, your contributions are used to help support the missionary activity of the Church. We need to reach out to those that have not heard the Good News of the Gospel, and your support helps make this a reality.
