Reflections from the Administrator's Desk

This Thursday, October 7th marks the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, the patronal feast of the Archdiocese of Regina, and after whom our Cathedral has been dedicated. Time and time again over the last century, there have many occasions in which we have turned to the Blessed Virgin Mary under this title of “Our Lady of the Rosary” for her intercession and protection, such as during the two great wars, the Depression and drought of 1930’s, the moral and social upheaval of the 1960’s and 1970’s, and perhaps now again in the challenges posed by the coronavirus with all its twists and turns. Like our Catholic ancestors before, we are to implore the Blessed Virgin Mary through the special prayers of the Rosary and its meditations of the mysteries of Christ’s life in union with His Mother.

From the Magnificat Mass Journal, we read this summary as introducing the Mass for this feast: “Today’s feast originated in 1571, when the Battle of Lepanto saw an invading Muslim army defeated in Greece after Saint Pius V (as Pope) called the faithful to pray the rosary for the protection of Europe. In essence, the rosary is a contemplative immersion in the lives of Jesus and Mary, and a powerful weapon in the spiritual warfare every Christian must in some way face. When we pray the rosary devoutly, we “put on the armor of God, that we may be able to resist on the evil day and, having done everything, to hold our ground” (Eph 6:13).

We have a double opportunity to observe this day with the solemn celebration of the Mass where this feast is kept in both forms, with the Novus Ordo Mass at 8 AM and the Latin Mass at 7 PM. At the very least, all parishioners should pray the rosary on this day. It’s a most beautiful meditative prayer that draws us more deeply into the mystery of Jesus’ life along with that of His Blessed Mother. There is much merit to pray as we do in the second part of the Hail Mary: “Pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death,” as a Dominican nun, Sr. Mary Jean Dorcy says, that after a lifetime of praying the Hail Mary, one could expect nothing else. Mary, Our Lady of the Rosary pray for us.

FAITH MATTERS:

While one can appreciate the difficulty of keeping up with the saints that have been canonized by the Church in the last 20 years, especially when the Roman Missal was printed and prepared in a certain year, how does one keep it updated to include all the new saints that are now included on our liturgical calendars? This will happen with the feast of St. Faustina (October 5) and St. John XXIII (October 11). This Tuesday, after the feast of St. Francis of Assisi, we celebrate the Apostle of Divine Mercy, St. Faustina (1905 – 1938) who as a member of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy, received many visions of our suffering Lord. For those who have adopted the Chaplet of the Divine Mercy, this feast gives us a special opportunity to thank God for raising up this simple woman and religious sister to saintly life. How many graces we can derive on behalf of those sinners separated from God and the life of the Church by entrusting them to the Divine Mercy, for those who are dying unrepented and unprepared deaths, and for those souls in purgatory, as we direct our prayers to the Divine Mercy of Christ on their behalf. St. Faustina, pray for us. Jesus, I trust in You!
