MUSINGS & NOTES FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR'S DESK

Wishing you a Blessed Thanksgiving! This phrase or its facsimile will be conveyed a lot these days by many people. Curious isn't it, that much of the images and thoughts will focus primarily on the food and meals we associate with this day, and not so much to Whom both this expression is directed as both the subject and object Who can truly bless and Who receives our thanksgiving. What a wonderful coincidence that the Novus Ordo gospel features the story of the ten lepers who appeal to Jesus to have mercy on them, and how only one of them was found to return to Jesus. Notice that he not only speaks words of gratitude, but how he falls to the ground, a gesture appropriate ultimately to God, Whom he praises at the top of his voice. Prostrate before Jesus, he thanks him acknowledging the divinity of Christ.

In our increasing secularism and agnosticism or what more identify as "being spiritual but not religious" we have practically lost sight of the original foundation of Thanksgiving both in Canada and the United States, as it is becoming simply another manifestation of materialism and excuse for over-indulgence. As society seems to become more cut off from any significant relationship with God (and the Church), the vestiges of Thanksgiving are wearing thinner, as we are becoming more self-reliant and self-defining about who we are and how we relate to the larger reality of life and God's sovereignty over all. The more fragmented and alienated we become in our overall connection within our families, this sense of gratitude for others in our lives suffers even more, so that even on a human level we don't experience the kind of healthy dependency and gratitude to many others in our lives that we ought to foster and acknowledge. We are not self-made individuals who are striving to make it through life all on our own, with only an utilitarian association to others only we need something from them. The more the sense of gratitude both to God and others disappears from our lives, the more impoverished and meaningless our lives become. We need to foster gratefulness in all areas of our lives, to achieve and maintain our human dignity.
