MUSINGS & NOTES FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR'S DESK

Within the Novus Ordo liturgical calendar this Thursday, September 29th observes jointly the feast of the three Archangels named in Scripture: Sts. Michael, Gabriel & Raphael, respectively: the defender of the Church, the herald of the Incarnation and the one whose name means "God heals". Meanwhile the traditional Latin Mass reserves this day as a first class feast for the Dedication of St. Michael Archangel. Since at St. Mary's Parish, we have the common practice of praying at the end of each Mass the prayer of St. Michael, it might be fruitful to reflect how this prayer and devotion arose. He is mentioned twice in the prophet Daniel, as one who helps the prophet and who will stand with the children of God at the end of the world, in the letter of St. Jude as the one who guards the tomb of Moses (and Eve), and lastly in the Book of Revelation who battles against the dragon. **Catholic.org** mentions St. Michael has four main responsibilities or offices, as we know from scripture and Christian tradition: 1) to combat Satan; 2) to escort the faithful to heaven at their hour of death; 3) to be a champion of all Christians, and the Church itself; 4) to call men from life on Earth to their heavenly judgment. Throughout history, the Church has frequently and regularly invoked the intercession of St. Michael the Archangel, as evidenced that the Latin Mass preserves his name with the Confiteor at the foot of the altar, and also at Solemn Mass when the priest adds incense in the thurible. Pope Leo XIII added a Prayer to Saint Michael in 1886 to what are now known as the Leonine Prayers, after experiencing a vision of demonic spirits attacking the Church. Although these prayers are generally no longer recited after Mass, as they were until 1964, Pope John Paul II encouraged the Catholic faithful to continue to pray it, saying: "I ask everyone not to forget it and to recite it to obtain help in the battle against forces of darkness."

Since St. Michael is officially acknowledged as the patron of grocers, soldiers, doctors, mariners, paratroopers, police, & sickness, I have resumed the practice of praying to St. Michael of every Mass in the Novus Ordo, for his intercession and protection is certainly needed more than ever it seems, along with intercessions to the saints of God.
