MUSINGS & NOTES FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR'S DESK

One of my favourite aspects of the Magnificat Mass Journal is its regular feature entitled inquisitively and whimsically “Saint Who?” where they do not feature the particular saints of that month, but more along a certain thematic consideration bring in a series of saints for a full page reflection. For this month we are invited to examine a number of saints who teach us about Perseverance. This is a virtue that is sorely needed in our times as many get discouraged and frustrated with how events in secular and spiritual realms turn out and don't improve quickly enough in our way of thinking.

“Perseverance. Without it, every gain is as good as a loss; with it, every failure gives way in the end to the glory of success. All the saints had the grace of perseverance, or they would not be saints. And, of course, the grace to continue in faith until death is a grace, a gift. Yet within the lives of the saints, we see the shape of this gift—its shadow, as it were, stretching backwards from the doorway of eternal life—in their heroic practice of the virtue of perseverance.

According to Saint Thomas Aquinas, perseverance, as a virtue, is a part of fortitude. “A man stands steadfastly, lest he be moved by the assault of the sadness from what is virtuous.” The attack takes place on many fronts, as the lives of the saints testify: from Saint Paul, with his monumental missionary work and intense spiritual conflicts, to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, who died without seeing her God-given mission come to fulfillment; from saints who lived for years with sickness to saints who died young after great suffering. All endured to the end, for the sake of the joy that was set before them (cf. Hebrews 12:2).

This month, as we celebrate our Lady's birth and holy name, we fix our hope on Mary. “For as mariners are guided to port by the ocean star,” Saint Thomas Aquinas said, “so Christians attain to glory through Mary's maternal intercession.”
